## 9-DAY ITINERARY

### Day 1 • November 9 • Los Angeles / Beijing

Board a convenient charter bus in the morning, and travel to Los Angeles International Airport for an afternoon flight MU586 by 12:30 pm to Beijing. Your adventure begins as you fly trans-Pacific aboard a wide cabin jetliner. Cross the International Dateline.

### Day 2 • November 10 • Beijing

(King Wing Hotel/5-Star, 17 Dongsanhuan Rd. S., Tel: 86-10-67668866) Arrive in Beijing, the Capital of China at 11:00 pm after a stopover in Shanghai. You will be met by your local tour guide at the airport. Transfer to the hotel.

### Day 3 • November 11 • Beijing

Visit the Tian An Men Square, the largest square in the world, and the Temple of Heaven, built in 1420 A.D., where the emperors prayed to heaven for a good harvest. Sightseeing includes the Palace Museum, also known as the Forbidden City, home of 24 emperors with a total of 9,999 rooms, the Summer Palace with the Long Corridor and painted gallery, Kunming Lake and Longevity Hill, Seventeen-Arch Bridge and Marble Boat.

### Day 4 • November 12 • Beijing

Tour bus excursion to the Great Wall, the 4,000-mile long and 2,000 year old construction is said to be the only man-made structure visible by the naked eye from the moon. Visit to the Ming Tombs, one of 13 Ming Emperors' Tombs is fully excavated and open for exploration. Roasted Beijing Duck Dinner.

### Day 5 • November 13 • Beijing / Shanghai / Suzhou

(Glamor Hotel/4-Star, 6 Tongjingbei Rd., Tel: 86-512-65338811) Morning China Eastern flight MU583 11:10am/11:10 pm to Shanghai, then take the tour bus trip to Suzhou. Afternoon sightseeing to the centuries old Linger Garden, Tiger Hill and Hanshan Temple. Visit to the National Embroidery Institute to see silk embroidery, an important local craft with 1,000 years history. Evening Dinner Show of traditional Chinese Music.

### Day 6 • November 14 • Suzhou / Hangzhou

(Regal Hotel/5-Star, 370 Gym Rd., Tel: 86-571-56199999) Morning tour bus journey to Hangzhou. Visit to Economic Development Zone. Visit to the centuries old Lingyin Temple, with the main feature of the 64.3 ft-high camphor-wood carved Buddha.

### Day 7 • November 15 • Hangzhou / Shanghai

(Guangdong Hotel/4-Star, 328 Yixian Rd., Shanghai, Tel: 86-21-51171888) Morning boat cruise on West Lake with relaxing stopover at jewel-like pagodas and tea houses. Afternoon tour bus trip to Shanghai.

### Day 8 • November 16 • Shanghai

Sightseeing includes the Yu Garden, a maze of marvelous pavilions, ponds, rocky works and over-arching trees. Visit to the Bund, a famous waterfront park. Business visit to the Pudong economic development zone.

### Day 9 • November 17 • Shanghai / Los Angeles

You may spend your final hours in China on your own in the morning. Afternoon flight MU583 will depart by 2:50 pm for Los Angeles where you will arrive at 10:30 am on the same day and return to your Chamber parking via bus.

## OPTIONAL TOURS

### 1. Hutong Tour in Beijing (USD35/pp)

During the two-hour Hutong tour, tourists will learn about China's modern life and its people. Starting with a traditional rickshaw riding through the narrow streets and tracing the historical life of an oriental country. Afterwards, tourists will visit local families, learn about their lives and cook Chinese dumplings with the family members.

### 2. Peking Opera (USD20/pp, USD40/pp for VIP seat)

Peking Opera is the masterpiece of China's traditional culture. It is more than three hundreds years old. The Opera covers several different plays, that include fighting and traditional singing and dancing. The show has beautiful colorful costumes, impressive facial designs and staging in the style of oriental culture.

### 3. Boat Ride on Grand Canal in Suzhou (USD25/pp)

The Grand Canal has a total length of more than 1,000 miles and was completed 1300 years ago by the Chinese people. It starts in Beijing and ends in Hangzhou. During the 50-minute boat ride, tourists enjoy the view of both modern and old life of Suzhou.

### 4. Evening Cruise on Huangpu River (USD25/pp)

The evening cruise on the Huangpu River in Grand Shanghai is gorgeous, charming and unforgettable!

### 5. ERA-Intersection of Time-by Cirque du Soleil (USD35/pp)

ERA is a multimedia odyssey whose inspiration is a combination of traditional Chinese acrobatic arts and modern technology. Not only will the audience be amazed by the acrobats' control and precision, they will be enchanted by the world that is created through the use of multimedia, technology, lighting and sound effects, elaborate costumes, original live music and a lot more.

### 6. Shanghai Maglev Train

(one way ticket USD15/pp, round trip USD25/pp)

The first commercial rail line of its type, the Shanghai Maglev Train travels at 431 kilometers-per-hour. This is faster than the Bullet Train in Japan. It takes 7 minutes and 20 seconds to travel 30 kilometers, which takes 30 to 40 minutes driving. Riding on this train will be an exciting experience!

### 7. The Legend of Kung Fu (USD25/pp)

The Legend of Kung Fu is a production that combines the elements of kung fu, story-telling, acrobatics, modern dance, and original music to celebrate the philosophy and skill of martial arts.
